### HOW TO USE THIS BOOKLET

The booklet you are holding in your hands will take you and your group of children on a world trip. Children from our Evangelical Mission in Solidarity (EMS) introduce themselves in these beautifully designed pages. All over the world, a lot of research is currently going on about children and being published in studies. In our booklet we have let the children speak up themselves in authentic depictions of their concerns, joys and sorrows. They allow us to share their everyday lives and are in the centre of attention themselves. Stereotypes don't stand a chance. What is important is the diversity of God's children. This makes the booklet so special and promotes tolerance.

### TAKING PART AND EXPERIENCING DIVERSITY

The children in your group discover the world of their peers worldwide. They engage with their issues and meet on an equal footing. They discover what they have in common and what distinguishes them. Yet we are all part of the large EMS Fellowship. The map of the world on page 22 and the »You belong to us!« game on page 6 will help the children to become acquainted with our global network.

#### EASY METHODS

You can use whole parts or just some elements of the booklet, e.g. show photos, paint or read something out – just depending on what suits your children's group. There are children's pages and thematic pages. All the methods and ideas are easy to apply and are open for many different forms of Sunday School or Children's Service. The children's pages in this booklet each start with a portrait followed by stories to read aloud, interviews, letters and photos. Notes on methods are always presented as a slip of paper. The thematic pages are called: Peace, Children's Service worldwide, and Prayer. Here, too, you will find ideas for creative practical work.

### GETTING TO KNOW THE MAIN CHARACTERS IN THE CHILDREN'S PROGRAMME

#### IN SCHOOL



# NATURE AND CREATION

On these two pages you will find ideas on the topics of Nature and Creation. You can use them for your children's group.

### WHAT GROWS WHERE? DISCUSSION WITH THE CHILDREN AND DRAWING PICTURES

Nature and creation are important to Dado, the Indonesian boy. Here you can discover, with your own group of children, what grows on the island of Sulawesi. Show the drawings of a banana, papaya, rice, and cassava and ask:

### HAVE WE EVER EATEN THAT?

### DOES THAT GROW HERE IN OUR COUNTRY, TOO? What grows in our country? Draw it.



### GOD'S CREATION – A GIFT FOR US




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LOOKING NARRATION WITH PICTURES ON THE FLOOR

»God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. There was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.« Gen 1:31

At the very beginning of the Bible, in Genesis chapters 1 and 2, we find that God created the earth and all that lives and blooms in it, within six days. On the evening of the sixth day, God looked at it all, »and indeed, it was very good«. On the seventh day, God rested from all the work that he had done.

At Sunday School, the creation story can be told graphically by bringing along an item for every day of creation (the sun for the day, the moon for the night, animal figures, human figures, natural materials, etc.). It is best if the children sit in a circle. The objects can be gradually placed in the middle. The children can all say together, »And God saw that it was good.« The final result is a big, colourful picture on the floor. Then you can recite Psalm 104 with the children and thank God for the great gift of creation.



### CARING FOR CREATION DISCUSSION WITH THE CHILDREN



God's gift to us is the miracle of creation. At the same time, God gave us responsibility for the earth and all that lives on it. Yet we also note: the earth is changing. Children think about how the climate is changing and the environment is polluted. Dado is also worried about the climate. He says: "The climate is changing so quickly. Sometimes the crops are small for that reason. And plastic bags lie around everywhere in the fields and in the rivers."

This point lends itself to a discussion with the children. You can name Dado's concerns and ask how the children see that. The teachers can ask questions such as:

### WHERE IS THE ENVIRONMENT IN DANGER IN OUR COUNTRY?

DO WE NOTICE A CHANGE IN THE CLIMATE AFFECTING THE WHOLE OF CREATION?

WHAT CAN WE DO TO CARE FOR CREATION?

#### MY PRAYER FOR OUR EARTH GALLERY WALK



One after the other, the children can now say what they are thinking about and what they want to pray for. They can trace their hands on a sheet of paper. Then they draw or write, in the outline, what responsibility they plan to take, what they have at heart, and what they would like to pray for. The hands filled with drawings or paintings can then be hung up in the church as a small exhibition – for adults too.

### FRUIT SALAD GAME

Different kinds of fruits are selected, depending on the size of the group, e.g. bananas, papayas and oranges. Then the children can be divided into fruit groups. Everyone sits on chairs in a circle and one child stands in the middle without a chair. The idea is that this child should regain a chair. The girl or boy calls out a kind of fruit, e.g. banana. Now all the banana children have to stand up and look for a new chair, including the one in the middle. The child who does not get a free chair goes into the middle. The game starts all over again. Have fun!

My message for all the children in the world: »I live in a beautiful village with traditional houses, bamboo trees and rice barns.«



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### **PEACE BE WITH YOU!**

#### THAT IS WHAT PIPIT SAYS

We have now heard what peace means for you quite personally. Peace is also important to Jesus. »Peace be with you« (Luke 24:36) – that is what Jesus says to his disciples when he first meets them after his resurrection. »Peace be with you« – that is what Jesus also wishes for us and for our lives.



**ERNEST**: Hello, Emso. How nice of you to visit me in Ghana.

**EMS0:** Yes, I like to travel. I love visiting children all over the world and making friends everywhere. I also like holding interviews. It helps me that I am so curious and always have my microphone with me. May I ask you a couple of questions?

ERNEST: Sure! What interests you?

**EMS0**: Actually everything! But let's start with your family and friends. Who belongs to your family?

**ERNEST**: My auntie, my uncle, grandfather, grandmother, mother, father and my sister.



EMSO: Wonderful. And have you got friends as well?

**ERNEST**: You bet. My best friends are Miriam and Michael. I play a lot with Miriam. Michael and I like football. And you?

EMSO: My best friend is a little bird called Pipit.

**ERNEST**: Funny! Elephant and little bird. My favorite animal is a hippopotamus. In fact, I have never seen a real one, but on television. It is big and it catches fish, I think.

**EMS0**: Interesting! I would never eat fish. I love leaves! What do you like to eat?

**ERNEST**: My favorite food is indomie, which are noodles, and jollof rice. I don't know how to prepare it, but I like it.



**EMS0**: Ernest, what does a typical week day look like for you? That would interest the children worldwide particularly.

**ERNEST**: When I wake up in the morning, I brush my teeth, bathe, and then I go to school. Sometimes I walk with my sister and friends or sometimes my dad drives me to school. School starts at 7:30 in the morning. When we close from school, I walk with my friends back to our pharmacy shop. My mother runs it. In the afternoon, I sometimes play with my friends or help my mother at the pharmacy shop. After school, I stay at the pharmacy with my mother till the evening when daddy closes from work. Then he drives us home.

EMSO: And on Sunday?



**ERNEST**: I go to the Children's Service every Sunday. When I go to the Children's Service, I feel like God is there with us. I worship God and we praise him. We pray and our teachers teach us about how God died for us and that he saved us from anything bad. **EMSO**: What does faith mean to you?



**ERNEST**: I believe in God. I know God to be good. He doesn't do anything bad and he doesn't want me to worship an idol. I also know Jesus. I believe in Jesus. I believe that Jesus died for our sins, to save us. I believe in that. I believe that all my sins are forgiven.

**EMS0**: So faith is very important to you. And many other children think so, too. Dear Ernest, many thanks for your friendship and the interview.

### **FRIEDA AND PIPIT**

### A STORY TO READ ALOUD

Tweet. Tweet. Tweet. Hello, it's me, Pipit. I'd like to tell you something today. Recently I lived for a while in a big fir tree, surrounded by fields and a forest. That was great. My nest was protected by two other fir trees – right and left. And when I looked out of my nest I looked directly into the room of a girl. Just imagine, one day the girl looked out the window into my nest and waved to me and I waved back. Naturally, she was amazed at first. I flew to the window sill and introduced myself. We got on well right away. The girl's name is Frieda and we have now become really good friends.

Frieda, her sister Thea, her mum and dad live in southern Germany, in a city called Rockenhausen.

When you read out the story, portray Pipit the bird creatively: as a stick figure or draw a bird. Have Pipit fly around the room. Read the story to the children and show the pictures.





ROCKENHAUSEN



Frieda likes being outside. I have often gone with her on her adventures in the countryside. The scenery is very beautiful: cornfields, fir trees, deciduous trees, bright flowers, grass, willows, bushes, mountains and valleys. The houses all have a garden next to them. In her garden, Frieda has even planted a vegetable and flower bed. Raspberries, tomatoes and flowers grow there. She has also sown carrots and peas. She thinks about the natural environment a lot. For example, she asks how the wind and storms arise and why there is flooding.

### WHAT THOUGHTS DO YOU HAVE ABOUT NATURE AND THE WEATHER?





Frieda likes best being outside with her many friends: Jule, Ivan, Eileen, Melissa, Jakob, Kim, Madeleine, Greta und Leonie. On her sixth birthday they were all there and we had a treasure hunt outside. After that there was a barbecue in the garden. All the children cut a stick to spear their sausage and hold it over the fire.

Frieda's favourite food is Maultaschen soup\*, Spaghetti Bolognese, bread with mushroom sausage, peppers, bananas and chocolate. She likes to drink water, milk, and cocoa without skin.

In the evenings, when I was sitting in my nest again, I heard Frieda's mum or dad reading a story to the sisters Frieda and Thea. Frieda and Thea sleep in one room. That is what Frieda wanted. That is why the two of them share a bedroom and a playroom. There Frieda plays with her Barbie house, does handicraft, dances or plays board games. Often, Frieda and Thea ride their bikes outside the house. They also like listening to music and her mum often says to her: »Sometimes you sing all day.«



\*Maultaschen are a typical south German dish. They are small pockets of pasta filled with spinach, meat, and vegetables. Because I want to get to know children all over the world, I flew away from Rockenhausen after a while. Yet Frieda and I have stayed good friends – to this day. Many people keep up their friendships over long distances. Frieda still has a friend who lives further away, like I do: that is Jule. She lives in Stuttgart, which is another city in southern Germany. Although she lives so far away, Jule is a very special friend for Frieda. They meet regularly and often think of one another. Just as I often think of Frieda.





### MY NAME – YOUR NAME DISCOVERING MEANINGS OF NAMES

Read out the text by Pipit. Then each child can say something about their name. The children can also ask at home about the meaning of their name. The children's group can design a big poster on which each child writes their name themselves. The heading of the poster can be the passage from Isaiah 43:1: »God says: I have called you by name, you are mine«.

But Jesus reprimands his closest friends, then turns directly to the children and blesses them. Jesus notices the children. He takes their perspective and is pleased about their faith. For Jesus, the children are a model for adults.

### A MEETING AT EYE LEVEL

When Jesus speaks he looks straight at the children. He gets them to come into the middle of the group. What happens now is a meeting at eye level. Jesus embraces the children. The meetings in the EMS children's programme also take place at eye level. The networking of children worldwide is intended to foster appreciative relations among them. Those who meet at eye level can see, experience and celebrate the wealth of diversity.

### **ENCOURAGING AND BLESSING CHILDREN**

The Bible story tells of Jesus approaching people who had been rejected or excluded and encouraging them to live. Children are empowered in their being and uniqueness, and encouraged. At the end of the scene, Jesus blesses the children. He blesses them in the name of God, for example for developing their own gifts and growing up free of care. Like the children whom Jesus calls to himself and blesses, all the children on this earth are loved by God. This story can empower children and let them find out that they are precious and that God loves them.

#### LET US SING TOGETHER WORLDWIDE

Do you like singing as much as I do? Worldwide different songs are sung at Children's Services. Try singing »He's Got the Whole World in His Hands«. In one verse it says »He's got YOU and ME brother/sister in his hands«. YOU and ME – that is what it is about. That is why it is written on the yellow balloon: YOU + ME! We get to know other children and find out where they live, what they like doing in their free time and how they worship at Sunday School or Children's Service. And in all this it is Jesus who connects us worldwide. The song »He's Got the Whole World in His Hand« is sung by you and many other children worldwide in many languages. That also connects us. Tra la la. Portray Pipit, the bird, creatively. Pipit explains briefly why the song »He's Got the Whole World in His Hands« connects us all. 
